We Have Student's Vaping...

As mentioned last week, the college has become aware of a number of students who are allegedly vaping. Myself and Mr Wilkinson have begun discussions with a number of students who have been identified as potential vapers, and we have generally been very impressed with the honesty of those we have spoken to. In short, we do not want any students vaping, full stop! We certainly do not want this taking place at school either!

Rest assured that if your child is suspected of being involved, we will speak to them in a respectful manner. If they are suspected of continuing to be involved then we will speak to you. These conversations are not about getting our students 'into trouble'. These conversations are about helping them.

We firmly believe that all students have a right to feel safe at school and unfortunately, vaping and the associated chatter is leading to some students feeling unsafe at East Loddon. This is not ok!

As mentioned last week, any feedback, suspicions or information re vaping at school should be directed to myself or Mr Wilkinson.

Curriculum Day

Thanks are extended to all families for the arrangements they put in place to cater for yesterday's curriculum day. Staff attended the college to focus further on the Science of Language and Reading, with Pamela Snow presenting a terrific day. Staff consolidated their understanding of things such as 'executive functions', 'cognitive load theory', 'The forgetting curve', 'explicit instruction' and 'TAPPLE'. Time was provided for staff to work in Professional Learning Communities to identify and plan instructional change and further enhance student learning.

The curriculum day once again provided a fantastic op-

portunity for staff to come together and further enhance the collective efficacy of our team, which basically means that we are all on the same page when it comes to the level and type of instruction we provide our classes and students.

Program of Student Feedback

Students in all year levels have been completing feedback for their teaching staff throughout the past fortnight. The focus of these surveys at all year levels has been on 'relationships', with a particular focus on the relationship between staff and their classes. Staff will have their data collated and shared, before shortly beginning the process of feeding this information back to classes.

I am really proud of the way in which all East Loddon P-12 College staff reflect on all elements of their teaching, and the commitment of all to continued improvement is terrific.

P-4 Numeracy

P-4 classes have recently started using 'Essential Assessment' in their numeracy program.

This online program allows teachers to pre-test students in different areas, providing information about the student's current level. It also identifies which specific concepts students understand or where they need more support.

Essential Assessment then provides tailored learning plans, online maths activities, and supporting worksheets for each individual student. The assessment data also enables our teachers to implement targeted explicit teaching lessons, small group sessions and hands-on activities to further develop concepts.

Post-assessment at the end of the unit identifies each student's new achievement level and demonstrates the growth achieved in that timeframe.

We are really excited by the potential of this program to extend high achieving students while also providing extra support to students that are struggling.


It's time to clear the air!
