Opportunity For Private Social Work Counselling At The College

On the back of the successful implementation of private speech sessions at the College, we would like to make College parents and guardians aware of the possibility of private social work counselling. If we receive enough interest, accredited mental health social worker Anna Garlick of RED BIRD ROOM, will provide this private service from the College on a designated day of the week. This private arrangement would allow for students to see a qualified worker discretely at the College, rather than rely on a parent or guardian to make a trip to Bendigo or Echuca for the same service. Being able to access a quality service at the College has proven to be most beneficial with private speech sessions and we expect that this would be the case once again, with students missing only an hour of class, rather than a half or whole day accessing the service.

Literacy Hint - COMPREHENSION



Reading is all about gaining meaning from print for the purpose of either gathering information or for enjoyment. Comprehension is therefore the key element in reading.

At parent/teacher/ student conferences we were talking about different layers of comprehension and I thought it would be great to share this further. There are three key layers which we are currently focusing on during teaching and learning sessions, be they whole group, small Focus Group or individual instruction time. It

should be noted that in the early stages Levels 1 to Level 20 (A to K), stages two and three are often combined.

LEVEL 1 WITHIN THE TEXT

This is basically literal information gleaned from reading a text, it's the ability to recall facts, or information about characters and events, and then accurately sequence these.

Prompts may include: What is the big picture? (Sum up the book in one sentence).

What was the problem and how did the character solve it?

How did the story end?

After reading the text, what can you tell me about ?

LEVEL 2- BEYOND THE TEXT

Readers usually bring with them background information (From other reading, from personal experiences, viewing or chatting) which they draw upon to gain meaning from the text. We often talk about making: Self to text/ Text to text and World to text connections and this helps us to relate to the text and make sense of it. Sometimes the author expects the reader to have key understandings and therefore information is often inferred.

Prompts may include: Has anything like this happened to you before?

How would (the character) be feeling when she ?

LEVEL 3- ABOUT THE TEXT

This relates to organisational or literary features in the text and how the author employs these to inform the reader. In an information text, this may include features such as headings, tables of contents, pictures, captions and graphs. In a narrative it may include detailed descriptions of characters, places or events. The student may be expected to think critically about the text in making responses.

When asking children questions, it is very important to provide some waiting time so that they can gather their thoughts and put them into words. Children who have language difficulties may require a little longer because of the number of steps involved in thinking about the response and then organising it into sentences.

Children also need to feel comfortable about initiating conversations about what they are reading so that they develop critical thinking skills. Feel free to allow them to break reading and share something with you (Obviously, as long as it's relevant to what they are reading).

Thank you for helping your child to learn to read through regular practice opportunities.
