Year 7 Vaccinations in 2017

Our current year 7 students have today had their first immunisations for 2017. The 2017 immunisation program provides free vaccines to Year 7 students. These vaccines provide protection against:

- Diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (whooping cough) – one dose
- Human Papillomavirus (HPV) – three doses
- Varicella (chicken pox) – one dose

Parents/guardians of year 7 students have already returned vaccine consent card booklets to the College, however if there are any further questions in regards to Year 7 immunisations, please make contact with the College Office. The Loddon Shire immunisation service may contact you about the Secondary School Vaccine Program. Schools are authorised to provide basic parent/guardian contact details to local councils for this purpose. Please contact the school if you do not want your contact details given to the Loddon Shire immunisation service.

The Little Bad Wolf - An anti-bullying message

The NSW School Performance Tour presentation of the Little Bad Wolf was an overwhelming hit with both students and staff. The talented and entertaining duo used puppetry and dialogue to convey to the audience that bullying was never acceptable behaviour. Friendship and confidence were two strategies used throughout the ‘fractured fairy-tale’ in which the good wolf, with the help of Little Red Riding Hood triumphed over three badly behaved pigs. When the pigs realised that they could no longer bully the wolf, they picked on their own. This twist revealed the true nature of bullies and a remorseful pig saw his brothers for who they were and joined the Wolf and Little Red to form enduring bonds of friendship.



Bullying is an insidious behaviour which your College is committed to eradicating but it is never an easy task. We encourage our students to name ‘bullying behaviour’ (remember that it is important to identifying bullying in terms of repeated rather than one off behaviour). It sometimes helps to have a friend present. If a child finds this uncomfortable they can ask a teacher to be present when they name the behaviour. If a behaviour is repeated after it has been named, then this constitutes bullying. In the case of physical violence such as hitting or threats of violence, this constitutes immediate reporting to a teacher who will initiate College policy.

It is not the bullied child who has a problem, it is the perpetrator who has serious issues that need addressing.

Literacy Hints

Today’s Literacy Hints are taken from the Commonwealth Governments free website Learning Potential eNewsletter <https://www.learningpotential.gov.au/subscribe> (Try checking out some of the ideas presented on the site).

When your child is in primary school they will be encouraged to read books at home. Here are some top tips for picking the right reading books for your child:

Visit your local library together and let your child choose books

Your local library has lots of books for children of all ages. Let your child browse the bookshelves and choose the books that interest them. If you let your child choose the books they want to read, you are helping them develop a sense of independence and responsibility that will boost their confidence. They are also more likely to want to read a book they choose for themselves, than one that is chosen for them.

Too many tricky words?

Try this quick test to see whether a book is too difficult for your child. Flick through the book and pick a random page. If you see five or more words on the page that you think your child might struggle with, they are probably not ready for that book yet. Help them to pick another one.

Stay with them while they read

Encourage your child to read out loud with you beside them, to help them work out tricky words.

Talk about it

Talk with your child about the books they read. Ask your child what they thought about what happened in the story, which parts they liked best, what was exciting, funny or sad. Talk about the meaning of the story and different words. Ask them if they found the book easy to read or difficult, so you can help them to choose books that are at the right level for them next time.


