#### College Drinking Water

We were informed early yesterday morning of the fact that our college drinking water had run dry. A delivery of drinking water arrived at the college by recess . Although the drinking water appeared to be discoloured for a short period of time following our new delivery, I assume that this was due to the need for it to settle after our system had been fully drained overnight. Please know that our college drinking water is UV filtered and constantly monitored by AKS Industries. A member of the AKS team is also attending the college to check on the water treatment station and ensure that everything is working as it should be. Students are also encouraged to bring a full water bottle from home each day if they would like to. Please ensure that water bottles are clearly named.

# Literacy and Numeracy

Parents who are at least my age may remember schools having a typing lab, a room full of fancy electric typewriters. I quite enjoyed learning touch typing because it was practical but I also thought it was a bit quaint and archaic.

But, in the tech heavy world our kids live in, touch typing is actually a vital skill. Students are now expected to complete NAPLAN writing tasks online and many school assignments are completed on laptops. Senior students often take class notes on their computers. Mrs McDiven has the following advice.

"Something that would hugely benefit students is to learn to touch type. This is something that you could support them with at home. If you ask them to type you a sentence or two, I'm sure that you will see lots of single-finger 'pecking' at keys. Ideally they would learn the 'home' position on the keyboard and be able to type without looking at their keypad. This may require some light supervision, including using a tea-towel or other device to cover their hands!"

Our 'Lone Pine' Planted by Mr Illingworth 2001

I would like to take some time this week to pay tribute to Mr Darby Illingworth who sadly passed away a few weeks back.

Mr Illingworth was a proud Australian who among many other things served in the Second World War.

I first met Mr Illingworth when I arrived at East Loddon in 2001. At that time he was the president of Bendigo Legacy and the President of the Mitiamo-East Loddon RSL.

For many years Mr Illingworth was front and centre at our ANZAC and Remembrance ceremonies at the college. Never one to glorify war, Mr Illingworth played an integral role in ensuring our students had a thorough understanding of the sacrifices that those before us had made. No doubt this was also the case for many years before I arrived, but the impact that he has had on our students remain remains to this day.

The next time you are present at our ANZAC or Remembrance Ceremonies, please notice how respectful our students are. This is a legacy of Mr Illingworth. For years he stood front and centre of our services and would direct our students. Subtly and sometime not so subtly directing them about when to stand and sit. when to bow their heads and when to say 'Lest we forget'. I was blown away the first time I saw him in action with our students. He was a kind man who was offered respect by everyone at our College.

I know that we are a little late in acknowledging Mr Illingworths passing and I apologise sincerely for that. If he is watching he would be shaking his head at me, knowing that I was never really the most organised. When arranging the ANZAC service each year I used to visit his home in Spring Gully and he would tell me with precise detail how the day would work. It was always worth the trip though because his wife Ailsa, (also a beautiful person), would get out the sugar biscuits and we would drink tea.

Mr Illingworth passed away on Australia Day this year. On behalf of the College can I thank his family for the amazing impact that he had on our students.
