### Literacy and Numeracy

Our classes from grade 3 to year 8 will be studying a unit of poetry at the beginning of term 2. Our teachers are really excited because poetry is such a fun way to explore language and it helps kids unlock fluency, comprehension and figurative language.

Poetry is like a puzzle made of words, feelings, and imagery (pictures in our minds). When kids read or write poems, they're having fun with words, and that's an important skill that transfers across all of their learning.

Playing with poems helps kids think hard about words and what they mean. It's like a brain workout! Plus, it makes reading and understanding words easier. And when kids write their own poems, it's like painting with words—they get to express how they feel and what they see in a cool way.

You don't have to be a poet to enjoy poetry with your kids! You can read poems together at bedtime or make up silly ones during car rides. It's all about having fun and sharing cool moments together. For younger students, playing with rhymes helps with their recognition of sound patterns in words which helps with their spelling.

Poetry isn't just for fancy occasions. Poetry is all around us in music, advertising and it even pops up in casual conversation more than you might think. When we laugh over accidental rhyming or an interesting turn of phrase.
