Spotlight on Art

Did you know the Art curriculum encompasses Visual Arts, Media Arts, Visual Communication and Design (VCD), Music, Dance, and Drama? Students at East Loddon explore a variety of art forms, with a focus on Visual Arts from Prep to Year 12, incorporating some VCD in secondary years.

In the P-4 years, students alternate between Art and Digital Technology each semester. Currently, Prep, Year 1, and Year 2 students are delving into colour and shape through painting and collage.

Meanwhile, Year 5/6 students are honing their skills in grid drawing and more advanced collage techniques. Year 7 students are learning about proportion drawing and sculpting, while Year 8 students are creating plaster sculptures using Modroc.

Year 9 and 10 students are offered a variety of elective options including 2D Art, Ceramics, Digital Photography, Printmaking and Wearable Art. Year 11 and 12 students have the opportunity to take their artistic interests further through subjects like VCD and Art Making and Exhibiting.

Art is an integral part of a child's education, nurturing creativity, self-expression, critical thinking, and social skills, and we are very impressed by the works our students produce.







Our seniors students have been treated this week to some guest speakers. These were not originally planned for the same week, but its sort of worked out for the better to have some themes reinforced.
