Students in their first full year of schooling will take part in an AEDC between June 10th and July 31st. The AEDC is an Australian Government initiative and has been conducted nationally every three years since 2009, with more than 95% of schools participating. The first year of schooling provides the best opportunity to reliably measure how children and families are being supported across Australia. Spotlight on Humanities

Did you know the Humanities curriculum covers History, Geography, Economics, and Civics and Citizenship?

All P-10 students at East Loddon started with a focus on Geography in Term 1, exploring topics ranging from local and special places in the younger grades to the significance of water and different landscapes in Year 7 & 8, and even factors affecting human wellbeing across the globe in Year 10.

In Term 2, Year 3-10 classes shifted focus to either Economics or Civics. Civics in Year 3/4 involved learning about rules and laws in different situations, while Year 7&8 learned about the democratic system of government and Year 9 explored the features of the Australian government in more detail, include the process of lawmaking and passing a bill. Economics in Year 5/6 had students investigating the

difference between needs and wants, and surveying family and friends about employment, while Year 10 compared economic systems and examined the causes of economic problems, such as the Great Depression and current housing crisis.

Next semester the focus for all year levels will turn to history.

Humanities covers a broad range of concepts, helping students become more informed and engaged citizens, both locally and globally. It's an essential part of their education that prepares them for the world ahead! We have a fair bit to squeeze into the last month of term. Most pressing is practice exams for our senior classes and a change of classes for all of the groups listed last week. More pressing for me, is that I need to construct a working timetable! Aggggh. That Agggggh is not the sighing style of agggggh, unfortunately. Its panic.

Next term we see the return of Frauline Burgstett and next semester (two weeks time) we welcome back Mr Kidman. What does this all mean for the classes that your kids take? Well for most kids it will mean nothing. For some though, the teachers that they have will change for timetabling reasons.

We had a visit today from 'Talk Money' which is presented courtesy of the Ecstra Foundation. Our presenter spoke to all students from years 5 to 10 about a range of age appropriate topics designed to prepare them for the world ahead of them. I sat in on the year 8 session and students were challenged to think about what money was and why and how it was used. They were also given some examples of how marketing can make you think you need items and encourage you to buy them, even if you didn't really need them. Older years focussed on topics such as Superannuation rights and

taxes. Interestingly our presenter was born in Afghanistan. He told the kids how his father instead of using money, traded sheep with farmers in return for a hand woven rug. Sheep=money. He was an interesting guy.

In 3/4 Science students are learning about magnets and magnetic force. They have been exploring different properties' of magnets, strengths of magnets and what
