
School Council Nominations – Another Call-Out To Those Who Are Interested

Professional Development For New 2018 Teaching Staff

BREAKFAST AT EAST LODDON

'Students who eat breakfast more frequently do better in school, and breakfast is especially important for children who are undernourished' (Adolphus et al., 2013)

'Promoting children's physical and mental health is important for maintaining their overall health outcomes. It is important to provide children with direction, information and opportunities to develop a healthy lifestyle and make appropriate lifestyle choices. In addition to physical activity, a good night's sleep, combined with sharing meals with family members and starting the day with a healthy breakfast, are important factors for positive physical health outcomes.' (MDI Secondary Schools Report 2017)



This week we received the analysis of the MDI (Middle Years Development Instrument) surveys conducted last year. Students who completed this questionnaire were asked, "How often do you eat breakfast?" Our Year 4-6 students who were surveyed reported that 88% ate breakfast regularly, which indicated a high level of wellbeing, compared with the previous year's survey where just 64% reported eating breakfast regularly; this was nearly 5% more than other schools in our district. Our Years 7-9 cohort did not fare so well reporting just 67% ate breakfast regularly, which was 3% lower than the previous year as well as significantly lower than students attending other schools in our district.



This week our Breakfast Program commenced for 2018. East Loddon P-12 College recognises the importance of promoting good health outcomes for everyone and provides a healthy breakfast on two mornings each week to encourage our students to eat breakfast and make positive choices. This year the Breakfast Program, conducted by our Staff members, Wellbeing Team and a number of enthusiastic and willing volunteers, will be held on Tuesday and Wednesday mornings. The Victorian Schools Breakfast Program, Brumby's Bakery Epsom, Parents Association, Foodshare, Colour Optics and Cardboard Cartons generously support

our Breakfast Program enabling lots of yummy choices to satisfy all appetites. While we encourage all of our students to come along and have a cup of milo, juice, cereal or hot buttered toast, this only occurs on two days each week, we would like everyone to have breakfast every day before coming to school.


